State of Vermont PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

WASTEWATER SYSTEM AND POTABLE WATER SUPPLY PERMIT

EXAMPLE OF	A permit may be required for the:	
SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	Regulates the construction or modification of potable water supplies and wastewater treatment and disposal systems in to protect human health and the environment.	

- subdivision of land into any size lots;
- construction of a new potable water supply or a wastewater disposal system;
- modification or replacement of an existing potable water supply or a wastewater disposal system;
- construction of a new building or structure, or campground including mobile home parks;
- modification to a building or structure, or campground that increase the design flow or modifies other operational requirements of a potable water supply or wastewater disposal system;
- connection of an existing potable water supply or an existing wastewater disposal system to a new or modified building or structure, or campground;
- change in use of a building or structure, or campground in a manner that increases the design flow or modifies other operational requirements of a potable water supply or a wastewater disposal system including the conversion of a single family dwelling from seasonal to year around use;
- creation of a campground (>3 sites);
- modification of a campground or mobile home park including modification or relocation of one or more individual sites; and
- use or operation of a failed potable water supply or failed wastewater system.
- **Types of buildings which require permits include but not limited to**: single family residences, accessory apartments, duplexes, condominiums, apartments, multiple dwellings/mobile homes on a lot, places of employment, hospitals, nursing homes, motels, hotels, restaurants, filling stations, boarding/rooming houses, stores, shops, buildings or structures used as places of public assembly, offices, manufacturing facilities, and industrial facilities.

- **INFORMATION REQUIRED** Requires an application form with specific information describing the project: previous permits, location, acreage, details of proposed building, number of units/seats/square feet, water supply, and sewage disposal; and plans prepared by a licensed designer including plot plan, soil data, designs of the sewage system and the water supply system.

APPEAL PROCESS	An informal appeal of a district office permitting decision can be made to the Regional Office Programs Manager, Division Director, and then to the Commissioner. A person aggrieved by an act or decision of the Secretary, other than an enforcement decision, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of <u>10 VSA Chapter 220</u> .
OTHER PERMITS & APPROVALS	Municipal; Health Department, Environmental Health (See Sheets <u>51</u> , <u>52</u> , <u>53</u> , <u>54</u> , <u>55</u>); <u>Act 250</u> ; Dept of Public Safety, Fire Safety Division permits or approvals may apply (See Sheets <u>49</u> , <u>50</u> , <u>50.1</u> , <u>50.2</u> , <u>50.3</u>); DEC Water Supply Public Water System Construction Permit (See Sheet <u>22</u>)
ACT 250 INTERFACE	Under the <u>Natural Resources Board</u> rules, the ANR Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply permit, when entered in the record, may create the presumption that a sufficient supply of potable water is available and/or that waste materials and wastewater can be disposed of through installation of wastewater and waste collection, treatment and disposal systems without resulting in undue water pollution.
