# Phase II/V Monitoring Waiver Application

### A. Source Protection Plan

A Phase II/V Monitoring Waiver Application for VOCs and SOCs will not be considered unless the water source has an approved Source Protection Plan that has been updated or approved within the last three years.

### B. Volatile Organic Chemicals (VOCs)

A water system may be deemed eligible or ineligible for a waiver from VOC sampling requirements based entirely on the vulnerability of the source water to contamination.

However, in order to apply for a VOC waiver, water systems must meet the following conditions:

1. The water system has conducted an initial sampling round (for new water systems, this means 4 consecutive quarters of VOC sampling), and no VOCs were detected; OR
2. A VOC compound was detected historically in the water system, but the compound has not been detected for three consecutive years of annual sampling; OR
3. The water system has received a reduction in VOC sampling from annual to once every 3 years, and no VOCs were detected during the most recent sampling (within the last three years).

If the VOC waiver is granted, the following conditions apply:

Groundwater Systems: The waiver period is six years. The water system is required to sample once during the waiver period. The waiver must be renewed after the first three years the waiver is in effect. Subsequently, the waiver must be renewed every six years.

Surface Water Systems: The waiver period is three years. The water system is required to sample once during the waiver period. The waiver must be renewed every three years.

### **C. Synthetic Organic Chemicals (SOCs)**

A water system may be deemed eligible or ineligible for a waiver from SOC sampling requirements based entirely on the vulnerability of the source water to contamination. However, in order to apply for an SOC waiver, water systems must meet the following conditions:

1. The water system has completed at least one full round of SOC sampling in the past three years, and no SOC compounds were detected; OR
2. An SOC compound was detected historically in the water system, but the compound has not been detected for three consecutive years of annual sampling.

If an SOC waiver is granted, the following conditions apply:

For both Groundwater and Surface Water Systems: The waiver period is three years. The waiver must be renewed at the end of the three-year period.

## D. Inorganic Chemicals (IOCs):

IOC waivers are effective for up to nine years (one compliance cycle). If the Drinking Water and Groundwater Protection Division (DWGPD) grants your waiver request, you will be required to take a minimum of one sample during the nine-year waiver compliance cycle.

In order to be considered for an IOC waiver, the water system must have submitted results for at least three compliance samples, including at least one taken after January 1, 1990. A water system may be deemed eligible or ineligible based on the test results.
