PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

CERTIFICATION OF LABORATORIES

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	A laboratory (public or private) wishing to be certified by the State of Vermont to perform drinking water analyses for public water systems shall contact the VT Department of Health Laboratory Certification Officer. The applicant shall submit the completed application with the fee and will also be requested to successfully participate in an approved proficiency-testing program and in a site visit.
ACTIVITY EXAMPLE	Water testing lab.
CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION	Drinking water analyses - test data are used to monitor public water systems (10 or more connections, 25 or more users) under the Safe Drinking Water Act. Results must be reported to the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation and by them to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
INFORMATION REQUIRED	Laboratory - Name, address, telephone number, name of owner, square footage, equipment (type and condition), housekeeping safety systems. Personnel - Identify all staff; name, education, experience, job responsibilities, supervision, authority. Analytical Data - List of analyses, methods, quality assurance plan and evidence of implementation; initial demonstration of capability.
FEES	Call for information.
APPLICATION TIME FRAME	From application to full certification approximately three months. Renewal is annual.

AUTHORITY	18 V.S.A. § 501b and 10 V.S.A. § 1672
