SIGNS - PRIVATE AND STATE

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT Privately owned off-premise signs prohibited; on-premise signs regulated--no permit; and state-owned and maintained Official Business Directional Signs (OBDS) and information plazas provided as alternative to off-premise signs with several limitations.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY

Signs directing traveling public to public accommodations, commercial services, points of interest, and cultural, scenic, historic, educational, and religious facilities.

CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION

Eligibility for an OBDS determined by location and legal issues.

INFORMATION REQUIRED

Completed application form with sketch indicating location of business and proposed OBDS.

FEES

Initial license fee for OBDS \$175.00 covering first year sign is up; \$100.00 annual renewal fee thereafter.

Initial license and renewal fee for advertising plaque on information plaza = \$25.00 per year per location.

APPLICATION TIME FRAME

45 days to process an application for an OBDS with additional fabrication and installation period; 60 days to fabricate and install a plaque on an information plaza.
