PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

PESTICIDES: RIGHT OF WAY PERMIT

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	Allows herbicides to be used in the maintenance of a right-of-way.
EXAMPLE OF ACTIVITY	Any use of herbicides to clear and or maintain a right-of-way requires a permit -- i.e. utility power lines.
INFORMATION REQUIRED	Two sets of geodetic maps with right-of-way marked; 5-year vegetative management plan, information on materials to be used, location of use, location of wells near the right of way. Advertising of intent to apply herbicides also required; in newspapers in affected counties; by radio, mail or handbills delivered door-to-door.

APPLICATION TIME FRAME	Requests must be made before April 1 of the year of the proposed spray application. Final action on permits granted by Commissioner after reviewed by Vermont Pesticide Advisory Council. From initial submission to final decision, the time period is generally 60 days or less.

APPEAL PROCESS	Permit conditions may be appealed to the commissioner within 15 days of receipt of notice of the decision.
