

State of Vermont PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

SMALL BUSINESS FACT SHEET FOR APARTMENTS AND RENTAL HOUSING

Accessory Dwelling Units, apartments or rental units may offer the advantage of providing housing for elderly parents or other family members who might otherwise not be able to live independently, or in the case of apartments and rental units, provide extra income to help meet family living expenses or mortgage payments. In addition to creating certain legal obligations for their owners, these units also must meet basic health and safety standards.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit (Sheet #1)* An apartment building is a public building. A Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit will be needed under the following conditions:

- an apartment is added to an existing single-family residence
- renovation of an existing building increases the number of apartments or bedrooms
- a new building is constructed
- a building is modified in a way that increases design flow or water or wastewater system requirements
- a new potable water supply or wastewater system is constructed

Applications must be completed by a licensed designer or a professional engineer. A permit application fee chart is available on the <u>wastewater regional office website</u>.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, Division of Fire Safety http://www.vtfiresafety.org

This department has jurisdiction over any public building. All occupied structures are public buildings except: an owner-occupied single-family dwelling, a registered residential day care facility, working farm buildings or an owner-occupied single family residence with an accessory dwelling unit allowed under 24 VSA §4406(4)(D). The Department will review issues relating to fire safety, building codes, boiler inspections, electrical and plumbing installations, propane gas tank installation and accessibility. (Sheets #49, 49.1, 50, 50.1, 50.2 and 50.3)

The Vermont Department of Health has adopted a Rental Housing Health Code to protect the health, safety and well-being of the occupants of rental housing. The Code applies to all rented dwellings, dwelling units, rooming houses, rooming units and mobile home lots used as a regular residence. This Code is enforced mainly through the local Board of Health or the Town Health Officer.
