RE: Effective July 1, 2014 - New Permit Requirements for Transporting Waste in Vermont

Dear Waste Transporter:

In October 2013, you were contacted by this office to determine whether or not your commercial hauling business required you to apply for and obtain a *Vermont Waste Transporter Permit*, basing this determination on the size of your vehicle. Effective July 1, 2014, the size of the vehicle no longer matters and any person that transports solid waste for compensation will be required to apply for and obtain a permit. See 10 V.S.A. Chapter 159, Section 6607a(b)(1)(B) on the back of this letter.

As a commercial waste hauler, you need to complete the enclosed documents: Business Disclosure Statement; Personal History Disclosure Form(s); and Vehicle Report Form. The fee is \$50.00 per truck, tractor, and trailer. You need to be aware that if you operate without this permit, you may be subject to a \$200+ fine and/or other enforcement action(s).

10 V.S.A. Chapter 159, Section 6607a WASTE TRANSPORTATION Reads in part:

- (a) A commercial hauler desiring to transport waste within the State shall apply to the Secretary for a permit to do so, by submitting an application on a form prepared for this purpose by the Secretary and by submitting the disclosure statement described in section 6605f of this title. These permits shall have a duration of five years and shall be renewed annually. The application shall indicate the nature of the waste to be hauled. The Secretary may specify conditions that the Secretary deems necessary to assure compliance with State law.
- (b) As used in this section:
 - (1) “Commercial hauler” means:
 - (A) any person that transports regulated quantities of hazardous waste; and
 - (B) any person that transports solid waste for compensation in a vehicle.
 - (2) The commercial hauler required to obtain a permit under this section is the legal or commercial entity that is transporting the waste, rather than the individual employees and subcontractors of the legal or commercial entity. In the case of a sole proprietorship, the sole proprietor is the commercial entity.
