Aquatic Nuisance Control Study Committee Meeting Pursuant to Act 57 of 2023

November 14, 2023 1:06 pm – 2:45 pm

MEETING MINUTES

Present: Senator Chris Bray (State Senate), Kim Jensen (DEC), Sarah Owen (VDH), Eric Palmer (FWD), Hannah Smith (DEC Legal), and Olin Reed (DEC).

The meeting was delayed until 1:06 pm to ensure member quorum.

- 1. Meeting Minutes October 31, 2023
 A motion was made by Chris Bray and seconded by Eric Palmer, all were in favor, to accept the October 31, 2023 Meeting Minutes.
- 2. Review and Discuss Act 57 ANC Study Committee Report Draft
 - a. The committee discussed and agreed to recommend having the ANC Permit for Pesticides process go through Type 2 Procedures, rather than Type 3 or Type 1 Procedures.
 - b. The committee discussed and recommended that a press release should be included as a permit condition for applications and treatments.
 - c. The committee discussed and agreed to recommend that a municipality, state agency, or federal agency be a co-applicant for ANC Permit for Pesticides in a public body of water.
 - d. The committee agreed to complete a final review of the draft by 11/17/23 COB, and the draft to be sent to Commissioners, with comments from them returned and due 12/1/23 COB.

4. Public Comments

- a. A private citizen commented that AAFM and ANR have a stringent and science-based process to approve and use pesticides safely in Vermont and additional burdens to this process would jeopardize future projects. They were concerned that requiring municipality as an applicant/co-applicant may also impact projects.
- b. Another private citizen was concerned about municipality requirements as applicant/co-applicant.
- c. The Federation of Vermont Lakes and Ponds representative also shared concern that requiring municipality as an applicant/co-applicant may impact projects. Requests clarification on what social media would be required.
- d. A private citizen provided their support the requirement of a municipality to be applicant/co-applicant.
