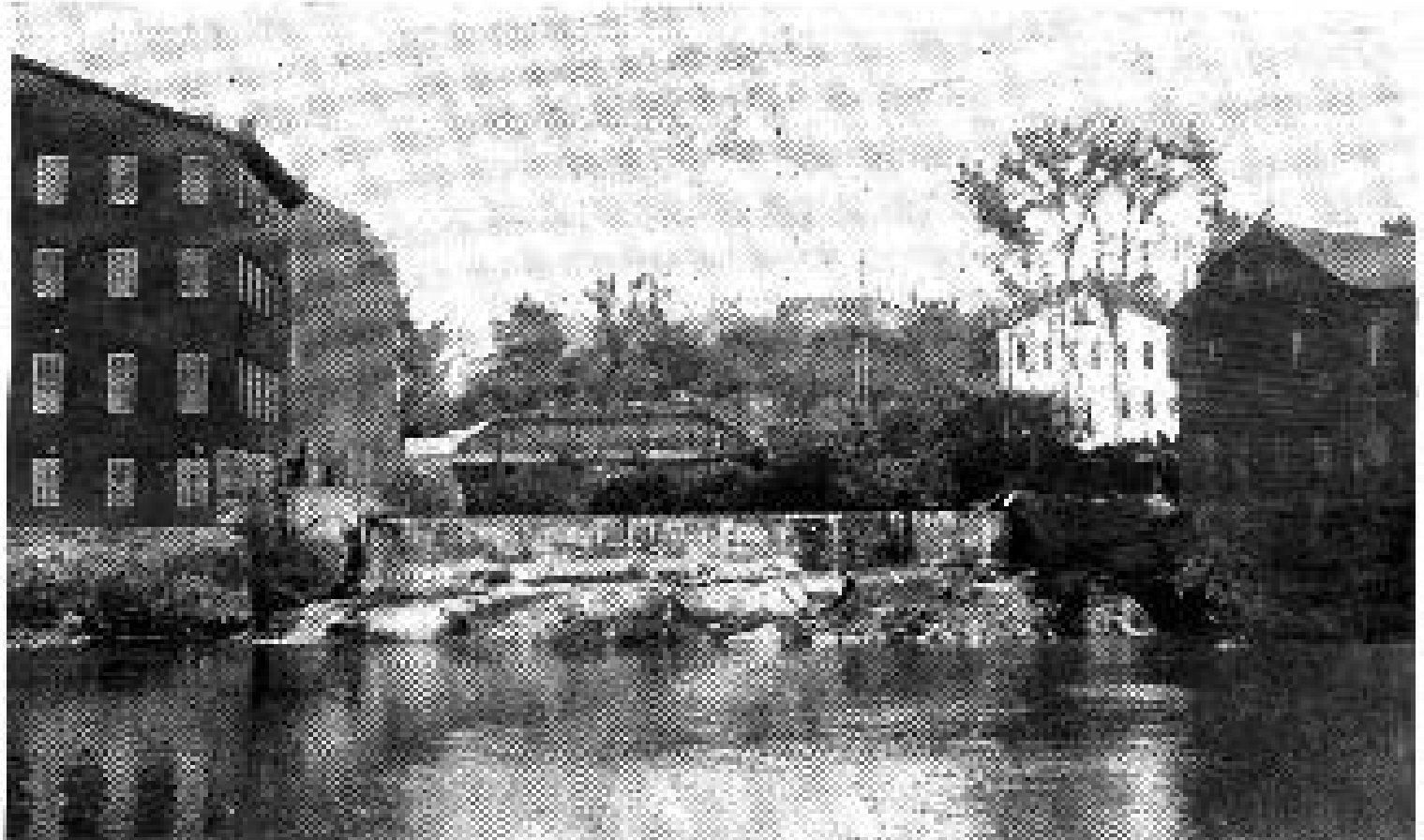

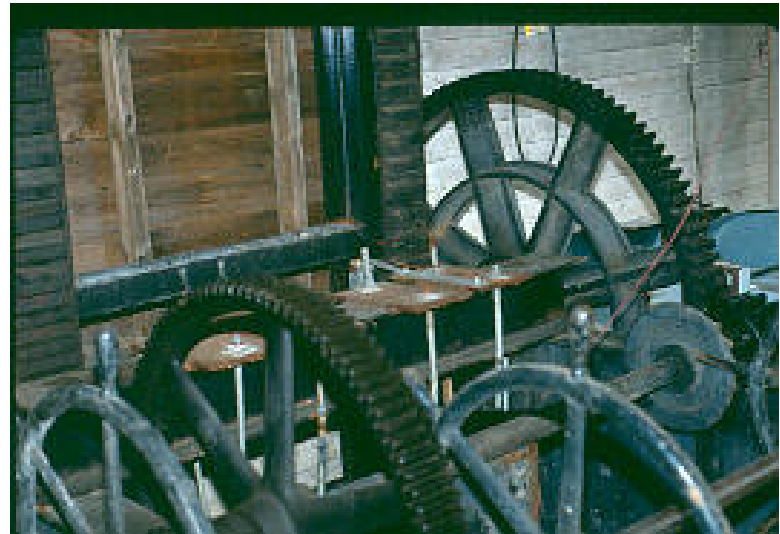

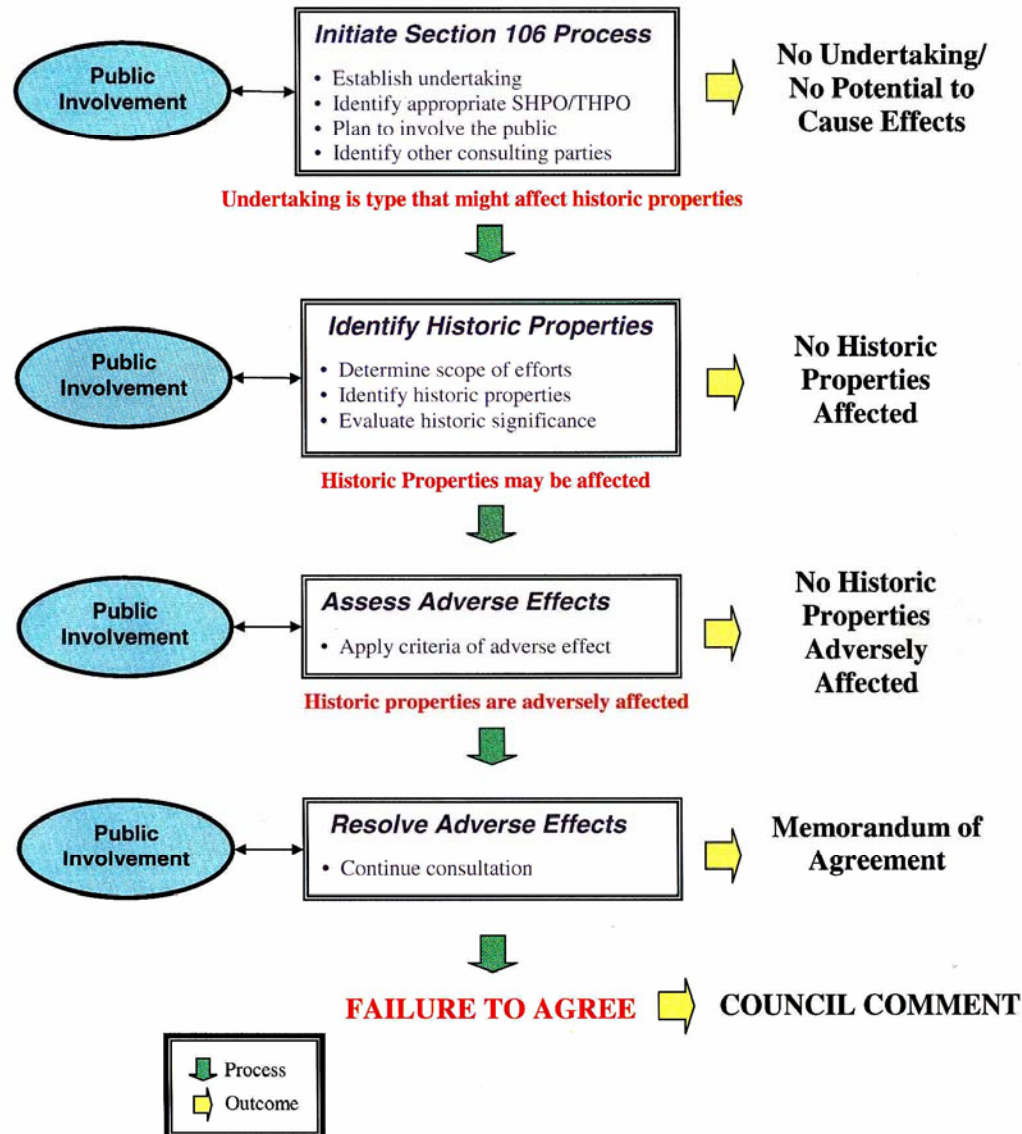

- Division reviews project to determine potential effects to historic resources
- Comments and recommends conditions as appropriate
- Public Service Board makes final determination and issues Certificate of Public Good



East Burke

Vermont Historic Preservation Act

- Division reviews project to determine potential effects to historic resources
- Comments and recommends conditions as appropriate
- If adverse effects, VT Advisory Council on Historic Preservation reviews and comments

TYPES OF REVIEW

Info needed for Review

- Project Description and Drawings
- Map
- Photographs
- History
- Previous Disturbance / Integrity
- Public Comments
- Professional evaluation of significance, effect and treatment

Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation

- Find a compatible use
- Retain historic features when possible
- Repair rather than replace
- Replace in kind if necessary
- Make new construction compatible but distinguishable from old
