EXPLANATION OF STATE AND GLOBAL RANKS

State (S) Rank - Value that best characterizes the relative rarity (abundance) or endangerment of a native taxon within Vermont's geographic boundary.

Global (G) Rank - Value that best characterizes the relative rarity (abundance) or endangerment of a native taxon throughout its range.

- **1 Critically imperiled (very rare)**: At very high risk of extinction or extirpation due to extreme rarity (often 5 or fewer populations or occurrences), very steep declines, or other factors
- **2 Imperiled (rare)**: At high risk of extinction or extirpation due to very restricted range, very few populations (often 20 or fewer), steep declines, or other factors
- **3 Vulnerable (uncommon to rare)**: At moderate risk of extinction or extirpation due to restricted range, relatively few populations or occurrences (often 80 or fewer), recent and widespread declines, or other factors
- **4 Apparently secure (common to uncommon)**: locally common or widely scattered to uncommon, but not rare; some cause for long-term concern due to declines or other factors; or stable over many decades and not threatened but of restricted distribution or other factors
- **5 Secure (common)**: widespread and abundant
- **H Possibly extinct/extirpated**: Missing; known from only historical occurrences but still some hope of rediscovery
- **X Presumed extinct/extirpated**: Not located despite intensive searches and virtually no likelihood of rediscovery

U = **unrankable**: Currently unrankable due to lack of information or due to substantially conflicting information about status or trends.

NR = **not ranked**: Not yet assessed.

NA = **not** applicable (Element is not a suitable target for conservation for one of the following reasons:

Hybrid: Element represents an interspecific hybrid without conservation value.

Exotic Origin: Element is not native to the State.

Accidental/Nonregular: Element is not regularly found in the State, in other words, infrequent and outside usual range.

Not Confidently Present: Element's presence in the State has been reported, but the report is unconfirmed or doubtful; Element has been falsely reported, and may or may not potentially occur; Element may potentially occur (e.g., habitat is suitable); Element was never present in the State despite presence in surrounding areas.

No Definable Occurrences: Element is native and appears regularly but lacks practical conservation concern in the State because it is transient or occurs in a dispersed, unpredictable manner.

Synonym: Element reported as occurring in the State, but the Vermont Nongame and Natural Heritage Program does not recognize the taxon; therefore the Element is not assigned a State rank.

An indicator of uncertainty about the rank, either in the form of a range rank or a ? qualifier, may follow a numeric basic rank.

For national and state ranks, a suffix that describes the population of a migratory species may follow:

B = breeding population

N = nonbreeding population

M = transient/migratory population
