FINANCING PROGRAMS

Water Infrastructure Sponsorship Program

The Water Infrastructure Sponsorship Program (WISPr) provides a funding source for natural resource projects (NRPs) to encourage water quality restoration or protection projects that might otherwise not have been pursued.

Eligible Entities

Municipalities Non-profit organizations Regional Planning Commissions Conservation Districts Watershed Groups

To be eligible, a municipal clean water project must sponsor a NRP and both projects will be funded with the same CWSRF loan. The value of the natural resources sponsored project must be at a 1:10 or greater ratio to the municipal sponsoring project.

How Does it Work?

NRPs and municipal clean water projects will seek each other through the program, WISPr. The sponsored project will need to work within the time line of the municipal project so both complete in a timely manner. The municiple loan providing for approved projects will have a reduced administrative fee rate with savings over the life of the loan equal to the total value of the sponsored natural resource project.

Program Eligibility Guidelines

- Sponsored projects must protect, conserve, or restore natural resources, including the acquisition of easements and land for the purpose of providing water quality benefits.
- Projects must apply to CWIP Watershed
 Projects Database to be considered. Applications
 are requested 3 times each year.

Sponsorship Program

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Sponsoring Projects (Municipal) Water pollution abatement and control facilities projects, such as:

- Wastewater treatment facility refurbishments or upgrades
- Filtration or disinfection
- Decentralized systems
- CSO downspout disconnection
- Traditional pipe, storage, and treatment systems for gray infrastructure
- Bioswales, rainwater harvesting, pervious pavement for green stormwater infrastructure

Sponsored Natural Resource Projects (Municipal or Non-Municipal) Water quality restoration or protection projects, such as:

- Wetland restoration
- Floodplain/stream restoration
- River corridor easements
- Woody buffer plantings
- Lake shoreland retro it, erosion repair using LakeWise principles
- Dam removal
- Land Conservation
