Environmental Careers and Opportunities (ECO) AmeriCorps is an AmeriCorps program within the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation (VTDEC). Our emphasis is on building capacity in rural Vermont communities through enriching experiences for our members and partners. Program focus areas include the following:

- Water Quality and Trail Improvement
- Land Conservation and Remediation
- Community Engagement, Outreach and Education

ECO AmeriCorps is funded in part by an AmeriCorps state grant provided through <u>SerVermont</u> from the Corporation for National & Community Service.

All ECO AmeriCorps members have some college education (preference given to college graduates) and will receive technical training and mentorship from ECO throughout their term of service.

VTDEC handles the administrative components of the program, including providing living stipends, health insurance, and monthly trainings to members.

Living Stipend: \$5,168.76 Education Award: \$1,612.43

Other Benefits: Training, networking opportunities, health care, childcare assistance, program support, mileage reimbursement for ECO AmeriCorps—related travel and being part of a program full of dedicated and intellectually curious people.

VTDEC administers the member's living stipend, health care benefits, childcare benefits, time sheets, activity reports, and other AmeriCorps and employee-related benefits and documentation.

Describe your proposed service position:
The ECO AmeriCorps service member will assist with communications with volunteers in our planting program in May and will assist with planting. They will assist with communications with volunteers in our water quality monitoring program in May through August and will assist with collecting water samples and delivering them to the state laboratory. They will assist with oversight of two college student interns for six weeks in July and August, visiting lakeshore homes to assess planting needs and plant trees and shrubs. They will assist with communications with volunteers and participants in our paddling events in June, July. And other duties as assigned.

Our organization is growing and working hard to meet the need for watershed groups to implement clean water and aquatic organization passage projects, while also maintaining our grassroots connections to watershed residents. The Volunteer Coordinator would bolster commitments to recruiting, scheduling, and educating members of the public. This
added capacity is a much-needed step on a path towards having a greater impact in the watershed and in the community.
Describe how the supervisor has adequate time and leadership experience to manage an ECO member:
The supervisor has 30 years of experience, including leadership in various contexts, and supervised three staff at Friends of the Winooski River last summer.
Describe networking opportunities that will be available to the member during service?
Friends of the Winooski River works with numerous partners, including US Fish & Wildlife Service, Vermont Fish & Wildlife, The Nature Conservancy, Vermont DEC, Vermont Natural Resources Council, Vermont Youth Conservation Corps, Vermont Land Trust, and more. The member will likely accompany staff to site visits and other meetings and events that would enable them to connect with staff of our partner organizations.

We serve all residents of the watershed. Our staff have engaged in professional development to learn more about how we can improve our work with regard to diversity, equity, inclusion, and environmental justice.
