

Responsiveness Summary for Indirect Discharge Rules
January 28, 2019

Comments Received and ANR Responses:

1. Suggestion to edit units associated with E. coli bacteria included throughout 14-1705, currently written as “colonies/100mL” to instead read “counts/100 mL” in the Indirect Discharge Rules.
2. Suggestion to include *Legionella pneumophila* to the Treatment Requirements for Reclaimed Water listed within Table #18 on page 111 of the Indirect Discharge Rules.
3. Indirect Discharge Rules, Section 14-1004 (f) Number of Pumping Units: Uses the term "average daily flow" which is not defined in the Glossary.
4. Indirect Discharge Rules, Section 14-1004 (k) (2) Pumping Rates: Says "for average daily flows less than 10,000 gallons per day..."
5. Indirect Discharge Rules, Section 14-1004 (k) (3) Pumping Rates: Says "for average design flows greater than 10,000 gallons per day..." The two criteria does not match and I believe it should. But more importantly, the "average design flow" is not defined in the glossary and so it is not clear if it is the "design flow" or something different.

Response to Comments 1 through 5:

The scope of the changes to the Indirect Discharge Rules made in this rulemaking are limited to those clarifying that the revised Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Rules will be the set of rules regulating smaller sewage and non-sewage wastewater systems. While the comments above are beyond the scope of the current rulemaking, they were forwarded to the Indirect Discharge program for consideration for future changes to the Indirect Discharge Rules.
