CAMPGROUNDS		
SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	A permit to establish or expand a campground is intended to protect human health and the environment.	
EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY	Any lot with 4 or more campsites on a lot that are occupied or made available to be occupied for vacation or recreational purposes by camping units, such as tents, yurts, tepees, lean-tos, camping cabins, and recreational vehicles. Replacement potable water supplies or wastewater systems serving a campground requires a permit.	
INFORMATION REQUIRED	See Section 1-305 and Appendix A of the Rules. The Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit application form and instructions are located at <u>http://dec.vermont.gov/water/ww-systems</u> , or may be obtained from a Regional Office or from your Licensed Designer.

APPLICABLE RULES	Environmental Protection Rules, Chapter 1, Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Rules effective April 12, 2019.
APPEAL PROCESS	An applicant or person who receives a determination may request the Program Manager to reconsidered a decision made in a Regional Office. A person aggrieved by an act or decision of the Secretary, other than an enforcement decision, may appeal to the Environmental Division of the Vermont Superior Court in accordance with the provisions of <u>10 VSA Chapter 220</u> .

	Natural Resources Board: <u>Act 250</u>
ACT 250 INTERFACE	Under the <u>Natural Resources Board</u> , <u>Rules of Procedure</u> , Rule 19(E), the Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit for a campground, when entered in the record, may create the presumption that a sufficient supply of potable water is available and/or that waste materials and wastewater can be disposed of through installation of wastewater and waste collection, treatment and disposal systems without resulting in undue water pollution.
