SUMMARY - PERMIT DESCRIPTION

To ensure that sewer lines are designed and constructed to proper standards.

EXAMPLE OF ACTIVITY

Any project that requires the extension of a municipal sewer line or municipal sewer service that is not considered a minor repair under the Rules.

INFORMATION REQUIRED

Description of project including length of extension, number of units to be connected, projected flows, design of sewer extension.

APPLICATION TIME FRAME

The performance standards for processing a complete application are:

a. less than or equal to 500 gal/day design flow: 30 days b. greater than 500 gal/day design flow: 45 days

ACT 250 INTERFACE

Under the Natural Resources Board https://nrb.vermont.gov/, Rules of Procedure, Rules 19(E), the Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit, when entered in the record, may create the presumption that waste materials and wastewater can be disposed of through installation of wastewater and waste collection, treatment and disposal systems without resulting in undue water pollution.
