RENEWAL OF PREVIOUSLY PERMITTED STORMWATER DISCHARGES

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	 General Permit 3-9010 (Renews Authorizations Under General Permit 3-9015 (sheet #6.2), and some Individual Permits) Coverage under this general permit is required for discharges of stormwater runoff to all waters of the State of Vermont that are not principally impaired by stormwater runoff, which discharges have previously been authorized by the Secretary pursuant to a stormwater discharge permit (10 V.S.A. §1263 or §1264) or a temporary pollution permit (10 V.S.A. §1265). Coverage is required regardless of whether the most recent previously issued permit has expired. Discharges NOT Eligible for Coverage under this General Permit: This general permit does not cover the following discharges: 1. Non-stormwater discharges; 2. Stormwater discharges to Stormwater-Impaired Waters;
	3. Stormwater discharges from new development, expansion or redevelopment.
