PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

DISCHARGE PERMIT: INDUSTRIAL

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT	Regulates discharges to surface water of wastewater generated from industrial and commercial activities. All industrial and commercial facilities that discharge wastewater directly from a point source (such as a pipe, ditch or channel) into a receiving waterbody (lake, river, or ocean) are issued this National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. The state of Vermont has assumed the NPDES program from the federal government and issues permits through the Wastewater Management Program.
EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY	Direct discharge of treated filter backwash, cooling water, industrial process wastewater (e.g. pulp and paper manufacturing, quarrying activities, water treatment facilities, etc.) to waters of the State.
CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION	This permit is for direct discharges of treated wastewater to waters of the State. (Facilities that discharge to a wastewater treatment facility, which in turn discharges into the receiving waterbody, may require a pretreatment permit.) Jurisdictional determinations may be obtained from the Wastewater Management Program.
INFORMATION REQUIRED	Description of the industrial or commercial process generating the wastewater, volume of wastewater discharged, type and concentration of pollutants present, plans and specifications of any treatment system proposed by the applicant, location of discharge.

APPLICATION TIME FRAME	The performance standard for processing a complete application: New & renewal individual permit: 180 days <i>NOTE: Performance standards do not include a required minimum 45-day notice and comment period.</i>

APPLICABLE RULES	Vermont Water Pollution Control Permit Regulations (1974) and Amendment (1991) Vermont Water Quality Standards (2017) 40 CFR Parts 122-136, 403-609
APPEAL PROCESS	Effective January 31, 2005, within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary, or any party by right, may appeal to the environmental court in accordance with the provisions of 10 VSA Chapter 220 .
