## **INDIRECT DISCHARGE PERMITS - SEWAGE**

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT Indirect discharge permit for all soil-based sewage disposal systems with design capacities of 6,500 gallons per day (gpd) or greater. Includes new, expanded and existing systems (leachfields and sprayfields).

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY

Sewage disposal from subdivisions, mobile home parks, schools, campgrounds, ski areas, etc.

CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION

Any existing, expanded or new soil-based sewage disposal system with a design capacity of 6,500 gallons per day or more requires an indirect discharge permit.

INFORMATION REQUIRED

Detailed soils and hydrogeologic evaluation of disposal site; may also involve receiving stream water quality and biological testing.
