

State of Vermont GROUNDWATER CLASSIFICATION INFORMATION

RECLASSIFICATION OF GROUNDWATER

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF GROUNDWATER RECLASSIFICATION	Reclassification of groundwater is not a permit, instead it is a designation assigned to a geographic area. Classification is designed to manage and protect Vermont's groundwater resources.
EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY	<u>Class I:</u> Suitable for public water supply. Character uniformly excellent. No exposure to activities that pose a risk to its current or potential use as a public water supply.
	<u>Class II:</u> Suitable for public water supply. Character uniformly excellent but exposed to activities that may pose a risk to its current or potential use as a public water supply.
	<u>Class III:</u> Suitable as a source of water for individual domestic water supply irrigation, agricultural use and general industrial and commercial use.
	<u>Class IV:</u> Not suitable as a source of potable water but suitable for some agricultural, industrial and commercial use.
	By default, all of Vermont's groundwater is classified as Class III Groundwater unless reclassified by the Secretary.
CRITERIA FOR JURISDICTION	Groundwater can be reclassified by the Secretary of the Agency of Natural Resources based upon a petition and the following considerations:
	 its use or potential future use as a public water supply source; the extent of an activity which poses a risk to the groundwater; its current water quality; its availability in quantities needed for beneficial use; the consequences of its potential contamination and the availability of alternative sources of water; and the classification of adjacent surface waters and other factors relevant to determine the maximum beneficial use of the aquifer.
INFORMATION REQUIRED	The information required varies depending upon the type of classification requested. Please contact the Drinking Water and Groundwater Protection Division for specific information.
