## **GROUNDWATER WITHDRAWAL PERMIT**

| SUMMARY<br>DESCRIPTION<br>OF PERMIT | The Agency of Natural Resources issues a permit for new, or increased, withdrawals of groundwater of greater than 57,600 gallons per day, when that withdrawal was created or increased after July 1, 2010.   |
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| EXAMPLE OF<br>REGULATED<br>ACTIVITY | Groundwater withdrawal for snow making, beverage production, industrial processing, commercial car washes, wood product manufacturing, golf course watering, mine dewatering.   |
| CRITERIA FOR<br>JURISDICTION        | Any person using the groundwater withdrawal for other than: a public water system (as that term is defined in V.S.A. title 10, section 1671; fire suppression; public safety; farming; dairy processing or milk handling; standing column geothermal energy production; or domestic, residential use.   |
| INFORMATION<br>REQUIRED             | <ul> <li>Applications are available on-line at the below website address. At a minimum the applicant shall provide: <ul> <li>A. legal ownership or control of the water source</li> <li>B. location of the withdrawal</li> <li>C. purpose of the withdrawal</li> <li>D. water source construction information</li> <li>E. maximum and average water quantity to be withdrawn per day, per month, and per year</li> <li>F. the place of the return flow for the withdrawn water</li> <li>G. inventory of pre-existing water uses in the area</li> <li>H. inventory of actual and potential sources of contamination</li> <li>I. public meetings and public notification of the project</li> <li>J. how the water will be efficiently used</li> <li>K. conceptual hydro-geologic model and water budget</li> <li>L. that the withdrawal is consistent with town and regional plans</li> <li>M. that no undue adverse effects will occur to other water uses (such other water withdrawals and wetlands)</li> <li>N. that the withdrawal will not violate Vermont water quality standards</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |

| APPEAL<br>PROCESS       | Denials of Groundwater Withdrawal Permits may be appealed to the Secretary of the Agency. Within 30 days of the date of an act or decision, any person aggrieved by an act or decision of the secretary may appeal to the Environmental Division of the Superior Court in accordance with the provisions of <u>10 VSA Chapter 220</u> . |
