PERMIT AND LICENSE INFORMATION

CHIP HARVESTING AND UTILIZATION

SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PERMIT

The purpose of this program is to monitor chip harvester operations to obtain such technical data and information as may be necessary and useful for forest management and environmental conservation purposes.

EXAMPLE OF REGULATED ACTIVITY

Logging operations that involve chipping wood for commercial use. The operator/owner of the chip harvester is required to have a license. Small, portable brush chippers used for landscaping, right-of-way clearing and similar purposes are not required to be licensed.

Annually, chip harvester owners must apply for a license by submitting their name and address, name of manufacturer, model number and serial number for each machine owned. Upon request from the Department, owners shall submit information with respect to the location and duration of chip harvester operations.
