# SMALL BUSINESS FACT SHEET BED & BREAKFAST

Bed and breakfast establishments are generally situated in private homes that take overnight guests in spare bedrooms and serve breakfast to the guests only. A bed and breakfast is a public building, not a single family dwelling, because the public is served in it. The purpose of the permits and review is to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public through adherence to adopted regulations.

#### DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

Converting the use of a single-family residence to a bed and breakfast operation may be exempt from the requirements for a Wastewater System and Potable Water Supply Permit. (Sheet #1\*) To be exempt, there should be no increase in water or sewage design flows, no new construction, such as additional bathrooms, and the results of chemical and bacteriological testing of the water supply must be submitted to the Regional Environmental Office unless you are served by municipal water. Contact the Permit Specialist or Wastewater Management Program Regional Engineer at a Regional Environmental Office for additional information.

## **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**

The Department will require that you obtain a Lodging Establishment License (Sheet #51). This license must be obtained before a person is allowed to operate an establishment that provides lodging to the public, regardless of the number of bedrooms offered for lease. If you are renovating, an asbestos survey may also be required. (Sheet #54)

## **DISTRICT ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION (ACT 250)**

Construction of improvements for commercial purposes may require an Act 250 permit. Contact the Act 250 Coordinator at the Environmental Regional Office for a jurisdictional ruling on your specific project. (Sheet #47\*)

The Fire Safety Division has jurisdiction over any public building. This department reviews projects with respect to issues of fire safety, building codes, accessibility, boiler inspections and electrical and plumbing installations. (Sheets #49, 49.1, 50, 50.1, 50.2, 50.3\*)
