There was no mention of the role or impact of failing, inefficient, or insufficient septic systems in homes and, more likely, camps, along the shore of the lake and it's tributaries. Not only septic systems, but drainage that "straightpipes" to the lake. You only have to go around the most damaged bays to see examples of what I am referring to. Is the impact so insignificant as to be accepted? Or are they included in one of the other categories?
