Submission of this completed Notice of Intent (NOI) constitutes notice that the applicant identified in Section A intends to be authorized to conduct a nonchemical aquatic nuisance control activity in the waters identified in Section C that targets only aquatic plants using benthic barriers, diver assisted suction harvesting, or a combination of the two, under the [Aquatic Nuisance Control General Permit](#) (ANCGP). To be granted coverage, all information required on this form must be completed and the requisite fees (Section G) must be submitted made payable by check to the State of Vermont. This permit and is subject to a 14-day public comment period posted to the Environmental Notice Bulletin (<https://enb.vermont.gov>).
