Shoreland Protection Permit Application Addendum Public Recreation Areas



Under Chapter 49A of Title 10, § 1443(g)

This Public Recreation Areas Addendum must be submitted with a completed <u>Shoreland Permit Application</u> when the proposed project serves the public, promotes the public trust uses of the water, and otherwise would not meet the Shoreland Protection Act standards as identified under section 1444 or 1445 of this title. For the Shoreland Permit Application to be deemed administratively complete, all information required on this form must be provided.

Public Recreation Area – Project Description

1. Describe (a) the recreational purpose of the proposed project; (b) how the proposed project provides access to the water for the public; and (c) how the proposed project promotes public trust uses of the water (e.g., boating, fishing, swimming).

2. Describe why the new impervious surface and/or cleared area within the Protected Shoreland Area are necessary to achieve the recreational purpose of the project.

3. Describe what feasible alternatives to the proposed project have been considered.

4. Describe how the proposed project has been minimized to the extent feasible while still achieving the recreational purpose.

5. Describe the best management practices that will be incorporated into the proposed project (e.g., establish shoreline vegetation, sediment control activities during construction, maintenance procedures, management of upland stormwater runoff through the establishment of vegetation and/or other infiltration practices, and other practices to prevent or reduce the effects of impervious surface or cleared area on water quality, aquatic biota, and habitat for wildlife and aquatic life).
