## PUBLIC NOTICE OF PETITION RECEIVED AND PUBLIC MEETING REGARDING BERLIN POND

## October 1, 2013 Updated November, 8 2013

The Watershed Management Division of the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation (the Department) received a petition from the **City of Montpelier** to amend the **Vermont Use of Public Waters Rules'** Use of Public Lake-Specific Rules pertaining **to Berlin Pond** in the Town of Berlin to prohibit the presence or use of internal combustion motors on Berlin Pond, including tools powered by internal combustion, petroleum, and ice shanties. Specifically, the petition requests that the Department initiate rulemaking proceedings to replace the existing rule after its title and acreage as follows:

- a. The use or presence of internal combustion engines, including tools powered by internal combustion, is prohibited.
- b. The use or presence of petroleum-based fuels is prohibited.
- c. Vessels powered by motor shall not exceed 5 mph (VUPW Rule 3.2(a)).
- d. The use or presence of ice shanties is prohibited.

The Department received the petition on July 25, 2013. The Department is currently considering this petition and seeking public comments.
