NOTICE OF COMPLETED APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING
BOLTON FALLS HYDROELECTRIC PROJECT

December 3, 2021

Green Mountain Power Corporation has initiated the process to obtain a new license from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to continue to operate the existing Bolton Falls Hydroelectric Project on the Winooski River in the towns of Duxbury and Waterbury Vermont. As part of this process, the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation (Department) is reviewing an application for a Clean Water Act Section 401 Water Quality Certification, required pursuant to the provisions of Section 401 of the federal Clean Water Act, 33 USC section 1341.

The applicant proposes to operate the Bolton Falls Project in run-of-river mode year-round and provide flows into the bypassed reach for aquatic habitat and aesthetics. Additionally, the applicant proposes to improve signage and provide upgrades to the recreation day use area and portage trail.

The applicant must demonstrate that the project will be in compliance with the Vermont Water Quality Standards by not having an undue impact on the aquatic environment, or the designated and existing uses of the waters of the State. ANR's tentative determination is to grant the certification with conditions to mitigate impacts on water quality.

The Department is seeking public comments on this tentative determination, during a 30-day public notice period. All timely comments will be considered in formulation of the final decisions. During this notice period a person may request a public information meeting regarding the draft decision. Written comments will be accepted at the address below, or via e-mail to Jeff.Crocker@vermont.gov, until **4:30 PM on January 7, 2022**.

Public Hearing: A public hearing will be held on **January 5, 2022 at 1:30 PM** at the Agency of Natural Resources Annex at 190 Junction Road, Berlin Vermont. Additionally, an option to join the meeting virtually will be provided. Persons having an interest in the project and the affected waters are encouraged to attend and provide oral testimony or written statements and data that would bear on the final water quality certification decision.
