

How to receive notifications about the 3-9050 General Permit on the Environmental Notice Bulletin

1. Create an ENB account:

- a. Add ANR.ENBAdministrator@vermont.gov to your safe sender list for incoming emails. All emails are sent from this address, and this will ensure you get all notifications.
- b. Go to: <https://enb.vermont.gov/>
- c. In the top right corner of the screen, click “REGISTER”

- d. Enter: First Name, Last Name, Email, and create a password
 - i. Note the password requirement is at least 6 characters, but there are not other security restrictions for the password
- e. You will get a confirmation email for ENB
- f. Follow the link in the email to confirm your account

2. Log into ENB

- a. In the top right corner of the screen, click “LOG IN”
- b. Enter your email and password
- c. Click “log-in”

3. Update your Subscriptions

- a. In the top left corner of the screen, click “MY SUBSCRIPTION”

- b. Click “Modify Alerts”



- c. Click “Edit” for any Alert



4. Enter ‘Activity Types of Interest’

- a. In the “Search activity” field enter “9050”
b. Click “Enter” on your keyboard to search
c. Check the box to the left of “General Permit 3-9050 For Operational Stormwater Discharges”
i. You do not have to select any towns, as this is a Statewide permit and all towns will be notified.
d. Click “Save”
i. This will bring you back to “My Subscriptions”

Activate Alert

To select your alerts, choose from a combination of the Activity Type and Geographic Location below. Each alert may contain one or more activity types. For the location you may select: one or more Towns/Counties; a Distance from a Point; or a specific Watershed. You must select at least one activity type and one location to receive the alert.

If you are interested in being notified about projects that may cover multiple locations/towns such as water systems or indirect discharges, be sure to select a large enough geographic area to capture those projects as the notification criteria will be the primary town listed on the application.

5. After 5 PM, check your email

a. ENB notices come from ANR.ENBAdministrator@vermont.gov shortly after 5 PM daily.

i. If you don't see an email, this likely means the 9050 general permit has not been placed on public notice yet.

ii. If you would like to double check before 5pm or at anytime, go to <https://enb.vermont.gov/>

1. In "Activity Name" or "Permit #" enter "9050"

2. Click "Search"

3. At the bottom of the page, look for **Search Results**

a. If it says, "No Records Available", the General Permit hasn't gone on public notice yet. You will be notified at 5 PM the day the notice starts.

b. If there is Draft 9050 Permit link, you must "Follow" the activity.

i. Click on the Draft 9050 Permit link.

ii. Under Public Notice Timeline Section click "Follow"

1. This will ensure you get all notifications along the way of the General Permit's issuance process.

iii. When you do receive the following email, you will need to "Follow" the activity, as described above.
