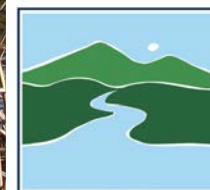
The Dorset Marsh is utilized by the community and others to enjoy birding, skating, and non-motorized boating

Dorset Marsh has a surface area of approximately 200 acres. There are less than 100 wetlands in Vermont of this size!



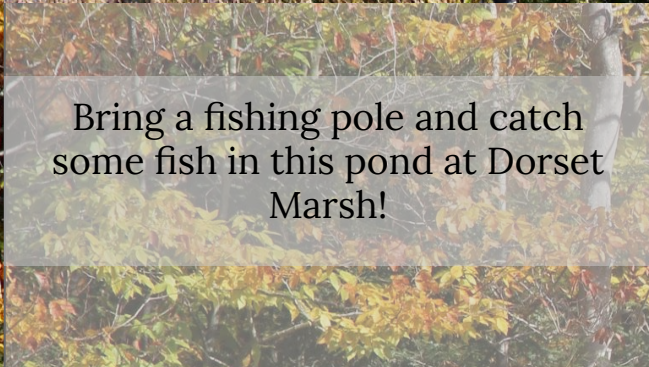
